Ex. 34:22 You shall observe the Feast of Weeks, of the first fruits of the wheat harvest; and the Feast of Ingathering at the turn of the year. ²³ Three times a year all your males shall appear before the Sovereign LORD, the God of Israel. ²⁴ I will drive out nations from your path and enlarge your territory; no one will covet your land when you go up to appear before the LORD your God three times a year.

Ex. 34:25 You shall not offer the blood of My sacrifice with anything leavened; and the sacrifice of the Feast of Passover shall not be left lying until morning.

Ex. 34:26 The choice first fruits of your soil you shall bring to the house of the LORD your God.

Moses would then put the veil back over his face until he went in to speak with Him.</p>	

	<p>Deut. 10:6 From Beeroth-bene-jaakan^a the Israelites marched to Moserah. Aaron died there and was buried there; and his son Eleazar became priest in his stead. ⁷ From there they marched to Gudgod,^b and from Gudgod to Jotbath, a region of running brooks.</p>
	<p>Deut. 10:8 At that time the LORD set apart the tribe of Levi to carry the Ark of the LORD'S Covenant, to stand in attendance upon the LORD, and to bless in His name, as is still the case. ⁹ That is why the Levites have received no hereditary portion along with their kinsmen: the LORD is their portion, as the LORD your God spoke concerning them.</p>
	<p>Deut. 10:10 I had stayed on the mountain, as I did the first time, forty days and forty nights; and the LORD heeded me once again: the LORD agreed not to destroy you.</p>
